### Environmental Permitting

The Marathon Palladium Project is a proposed open pit mine and processing facility. Construction is planned to begin in 2022 and a 13 year mine life is expected to begin in 2023.

Prior to Project construction, a Joint Review Panel (federal and provincial regulators) must approve the environmental assessment, and several detailed environmental permits will be required. GenPGM is committed to keeping local and Indigenous communities informed about the Project design, potential impacts, planned monitoring programs and mitigation measures.

Environmental permits required for the Project will include:

- End Land Use and Closure Planning
- Fish Habitat Loss
- Overall Benefit for Woodland Caribou
- Water Management and Discharge
- Air Quality and Climate Change



Municipal approvals include a site plan agreement to permit mining operations, and subsequent permits required for the construction of any Project buildings.
